Marion Smith Steves of Comfort, Texas was married to Henry Steves. She obtained a bachelor's degree from the University of Texas. She had quite an interesting life with much traveling. She and Mr. Steves divorced, and she moved to California where she married Venton Sisk in 1947. Marion passed away June 21, 1994, in Pagosa Springs, Colorado.

Jessie Dell McCrocklin Theis was born June 8,1888. She was married twice, once to Adolph Phillip Theis who passed away in 1923. She then married August J. Theis who passed away in 1946. Jessie passed away July 16, 1984, at the age of 96 and was buried in Boerne.

Zuma Annie McNatt Weir was born December 16, 1882 in Blanco County. She was married to Luther Armon Weir, and they had one child, Landis Larry. Zuma taught at the Spicewood School (1926) and Hickory Creek School (1942-43) which later became Smithwick School and then consolidated with Marble Falls in 1945.
